Offeryn cyn-ymgysylltu – Teithio Llesol

Pre-engagement tool – Active Travel

- Made tweaks to allow DMW maps to be embedded this allowed for Table of Contents and feature information panel to display
- Saw the limitations of existing spatial engagement tools with regards to:
 - Base maps
 - Not displaying overlay layers/can't interact with overlay layers
 - Can't select features on a map as part of a response
- Using standard Django open source data package

Iteriad cyntaf – Coedwig Genedlaethol

First iteration – National Forest

- Drop a pin on a map capture coordinates, but no constraints or validations
- Basic question types
- Could display layers, but couldn't interact with layers – view only
- 1458 responses





- Validations introduced zoom level, layer validation, feature validation
- Pull through info as part of a response – select a feature
- Image uploader introduced
- Locate me prompt

- Work done to automate the process of generating survey responses as a spatial layer
- Nicely formatted feature info
- Images rendered out properly
- Challenge with picklists and checkboxes, etc. – had to be manipulated so that the data displayed correctly



- 25 surveys
- Bridgend Active Travel survey prize incentive!
 - 221 users
 - 226 responses
- Digital inclusion survey
 - 113 users
 - 188 responses

Datblygiadau yn y dyfodol Future developments

- Looking at moderation process for approving survey responses so they become publicly viewable
- Map per question rather than per survey AT asking users to place benches and bins along a proposed route
- Validation models we have used for surveys can be reused for more general data collection on a map – use the same validations when users are editing data on a map
- Look at allowing users to capture lines or polygons as part of a survey

Datblygiadau yn y dyfodol Future developments



- In parallel also been improving data editing in DataMapWales as well – new editable feature info panel to allow users to edit in form fields with different widgets, rather than in table
- For future projects, we have greater options in terms of user engagement – surveys more appropriate for simple spatial data collection. Maps more suited for complex spatial data collection and simpler fields
- In future, the two could merge so that surveys don't sit on Django pages, but are integrated into mapstore
